THE 39TH CRITCHLEY SALVER

The Critchley Salver is open to lady amateur golfers only.

TERMS OF COMPETITION

1. The competition will be 36 hole scratch medal over one day, with 18 holes played on the New Course in morning and 18 holes on the Old Course in the afternoon.
2. The winner will be the player with the lowest aggregate gross score. In the event of any tie, prizes will be decided with count backs over the second round, followed by the score over the back nine holes. If there is still a tie the result will be determined on the basis of the last 6 holes, last 3 holes and finally the 18th hole. If this countback procedure does not produce a winner the overall result will be a tie.
3. Playing partners and tee times will be allotted by the Club.
4. Players will be provided with a buffet lunch.
5. A practice round is available **after 3pm** on Monday 25th May. **No** practice rounds or practice at the club will be permitted before this time. Tee times must be booked through the Caddiemaster.
6. Competitors wishing to reserve a caddie should contact the Caddiemaster on 01344 626 064.

Entries

1. Entries will be accepted only from lady Amateur golfers whose handicap does not exceed FIVE strokes.
2. In the event of applications exceeding 36 the higher handicap players will be balloted out immediately after the closing date.
3. Entries Close on Friday, 8th May 2020
4. The Committee reserves the right to accept or refuse or subsequently reject any entry without giving reasons for its decision

Results

1. The winner will hold the title for one year and will be presented with the Critchley Salver which will be retained by the Club.
2. The winner will receive an engraved Armada dish.
3. Vouchers will be given to players in the first five places, and the best round on the each course.
4. No player to win more than one prize.

WAGR

Women golfers playing in top English scratch events will have new opportunities to improve their world ranking in 2020. At present 36 hole competitions do not qualify for WAGR points, therefore existing 36 hole scratch events have been paired up to create five 72-hole tournaments of which competitors will eligible to receive World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR) points for playing in both.

The Critchley Salver at Sunningdale on Tuesday 26th May 2020 will be combined with the Astor Salver at The Berkshire on Wednesday 3rd June 2020 to create the Critchley Astor Salver. Both events will be run separately with their own prizes, but the combined totals over 72 holes will qualify for the purposes of WAGR points.
